Criteria for Award

The award is open to all researchers, clinicians and consumers and organisations who seek to advance the availability of evidence-based interventions for those who are experiencing mental illness in the Australian community. The entry should describe the activity, the target audience and the evidence base for the research/knowledge that is being promoted. It should also describe the impact that their activity has had and how this was measured.



These details are to be provided by the Nominator. These criteria are judged by a panel of three, with one nominated by Rotary and two by the SMHR Executive.

Details of Award

The award consists of a plaque and the expenses of attending the SMHR conference. The expenses are for up to \$3,000 and include registration at SMHR conference for 2018 for two nights' accommodation at the SMHR 2018 conference venue, and air travel.

Obligations

The nominee must be a financial member of SMHR. The successful applicant is required to present at the 2018 SMHR Conference for 25 minutes on Friday 30th November 2018. The successful applicant is also required to be available for no less than three speaking engagements over the ensuing 12 months. (Note that if the future speaking engagements are not held in the town or city where the successful applicant lives, then the Australian Rotary Health will cover the cost of airfare and accommodation).
